Recommended that practitioners spend 1 hour per month on audit activity

Recommended that practitioners spend 1 hour per month on audit activity

Self assessment Measurement of individual/departmental compliance with guidelines/protocols or assessment of outcomes Participation in ERS COPD audit Compliance with lung cancer guidelines, guidelines on treatment/investigation of pneumonia, pulmonary embolism, COPD Turnaround times for departmental activities – out-patient referral, bronchoscopy, sleep assessment etc. Appropriateness of PFT/sleep study requests Appropriateness of home oxygen/nebuliser/CPAP/NIV prescribing 	Recommended that practitioners spend 1 hour per month on audit activity
